IT'S FOR THE BIRDS

During spring time the last couple of years, we have been visited by certain avian guests, Purple Martins. These birds build nests in breezeways and lay and hatch eggs. While unsanitary and quite a nuisance, these birds are also a great help, as insectivores they eat all kinds of insects and bugs.

As a solution, we have ordered bird houses and will be placing them in strategic locations around the property. After we remove nests already being built by the birds, they will move into these homes for the season. The positive effect the birds have (free pest control) will now have no negative impact (unsanitary conditions in the breezeways).
